Nativity Display



A display of creches from the collection of Jill Pretz will be in the curio cabinet located in the narthex, beginning the Sunday after Thanksgiving and continuing through January. Jill has been collecting creches, or nativity scenes, since 1970, although most of her early sets were destroyed in a house fire in 2003. Since then, she has gathered together over sixty sets. Many were purchased from 10,000 Villages, some are antiques bought on Craig's List and some were gifts from friends who helped rebuild her collection after the fire. Several are hand carved by Jeff Pretz. The displays are from various cultures and countries but they all tell the beautiful story of the birth of the Baby Jesus, Christ the Lord.

December: National Safe Toys and Gifts Month

The Health and Wellness Committee is recognizing National Safe Toys and Gifts month. The following tips should be kept in mind when shopping for the holidays:

- Balloons children can choke or suffocate on deflated or broken balloons. Keep them away from children, especially those balloons that should be discarded.
- Small toys or toys with small parts children younger than 3 should be kept away from toys or part of toys that can cause choking.
- Scooters and other riding toys riding toys, skateboards, and in-line skates go fast and falls can be deadly. Helmets and safety gear should be worn properly at all times and sized to fit.
- Magnets high powered magnet sets are dangerous and should be kept away from children. Whether marketed for children or adults, building and play sets with small magnets should also be kept away from small children.

Once gifts are opened:

- Immediately discard plastic wrapping or other packaging, before they are used as play things.
- Keep toys appropriately for older children away from younger ones.
- Battery charging should be supervised by adults and away from children.

With combined efforts of all involved, everyone will have a safe and joyous holiday.


IT'S OUR TENTH ANNUAL COOKIE WALK!

Disaster Relief Trip to West Virginia

Plans are being made for the 15th Lutheran Disaster Response trip from our area which will take place April 30-May 6, 2017. We will be going to wild and wonderful West Virginia! They had a devastating flood on June 23rd which left thousands of homes destroyed and killed 23 people. There are five counties still under a state of emergency declaration. Twelve (of the 55) counties across the south central portion of the state were hit particularly hard. Their volunteer response capacity is still gearing up and there are not a great number of details to share with you at this point. They will be ready for us in the spring and we will have a great opportunity to learn, to grow and to share the love of Christ with our



Pastor's Letter

Who, then, are those to whom this joyful news is to be proclaimed? Those who are faint-hearted and feel the burden of their sins, like the shepherds, to whom the angels proclaim the message, letting the great lords in Jerusalem, who do not accept it, go on sleeping.

~~ from Luther's Christmas Day Sermon, 1530

The month before us can be one of the most frenetic of the whole year. All the usual trappings of the coming Christmas season – presents, decoration, parties, food, travel – wail with their siren song of the "perfect Christmas." Nothing bad about any of them. But they lay claim to us and especially to our time in ways that can feel invasive and domineering. Without care and focused attention to your activities, you can easily become a captive to the Happy-Happy-Joy-Joy expectation of the month of December.

And so, we tell ourselves that we will slow down this year ... we will buy fewer presents ... send a few less cards to people we never hear back from ... eat fewer cookies and drink less egg nog ... and spend more time with our family at home, in quiet enjoyment of the gift of family. Yes, we will do all of this as soon as December 25th has passed and our lives slow down enough to allow it. We allow ourselves to be taken captive by the illusion that we can create a perfect experience in this crafted season that has been revving up its engines since before Halloween.

Do you want a real break from it? Then ask yourself whether you are the person to whom Brother Martin speaks in this short section from his 1530 Christmas sermon. Ask yourself whether you are one of "those who are faint-hearted and feel the burden of their sins, like the shepherds." When we crawl out from under the smothering delusion that we are ever able to create a perfect anything in the world, we can allow ourselves to acknowledge the faintness of our hearts some days, and the burden of our sins most days. We can honestly stare down the emptiness of the world and the brokenness of our lives, and invest our lives in the one who doesn't shy away from the reality we face, but instead embraces it, so as to defeat it.

It is the baby we await throughout our advent season, and the Risen Christ we look for at the end of all times. It is the manger's feedbox from which the first herald cry is voiced, and the temple in the Holy City from which we hear the final call of "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." It is the message that keeps us awake at night with its utter joy and mystery, and the message through which the great lords of our day sleep away the night.

I invite you to come, whether you are faint of heart or poor in spirit or burdened by your sin or weak in your flesh. Come to the One who knows exactly what answer you need to hear and what assurance will bring you hope. Come to meet the "coming one" who comes into your soul with the redemption you crave. And when you arrive, proclaim the expectant word of the Advent season, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.

Letter From the Vicar



Greetings to all my brothers and sisters in Christ at St. Peter's Lutheran Church.

December is upon us and along with it the craziness of the holiday season. For many, this is a time of family gatherings and parties with friends. It can feel like there is so much to do that it would be impossible to ever feel alone. However, for others, the holiday season can be the most lonely and depressing time of the year; especially if the season highlights the loss of a loved one. For years, my large family which had always gathered on Christmas Eve was splintered and a dark cloud hung over the holidays after my cousin was killed on Christmas Eve in a car wreck. That long standing tradition basically stopped that night and was never really recovered. Instead of coming together and bonding, members of the family went into isolation and separated themselves. It was an easy and almost instinctual thing to do but was

certainly not the best thing to do. In our times of grief, we need friends and family even more. We need common experiences and common stories to share and reminisce about.

Such is the case in all aspects of our lives, especially with our Christian family. We need the presence of our Christian brothers and sisters in order to fully live out our lives as the body of Christ. In 1 Corinthians 12 it says, "Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many... If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? ... The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you,' nor again the head to the feet... On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable." Our senses are connected with all of these parts of the body: sight, hearing, touch, etc. and these are the ways in which we interact with this amazing creation of God's in which we get to live. We need each other's presence and senses to enhance our own interaction with God and magnify our experience of God in the world around us.

This is one of the reasons that small groups are such an important part of living our lives as a Christian. I would encourage everyone, if they have not already done so, to find some small group in which to engage and live alongside as members of the Body. New groups form all the time. If you do not see a group that seems to fit a particular need you have, chances are there are others who share that same need. Perhaps, this is an amazing opportunity that is available in the creation of such a new group. Regardless of the success of the group, the journey will have become a shared experience and a shared story for those who took that step. That bond of shared experience was really the point all along and if you feel closer to God and to those around you then it was a huge success.

Speaking of new groups, there is a new group forming right now — a new business-persons breakfast group beginning in January. This group, will be looking at topics directly relating to living out one's faith as a person in the business world and the unique challenges that can be faced by those in business related careers. From the Director of Music

O Antiphons

The hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" is based on a <u>series of Antiphons</u> (a short sentence sung or recited before or after a psalm or canticle) that were appointed for the last days of Advent. Each of these "O Antiphons" describes the coming Savior using imagery from the Old Testament prophecies which foretold of Jesus' coming. Here they are in order:

December 17: O Sapientia (O Wisdom)

O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from one end to the other, mightily and sweetly ordering all things: Come and teach us the way of prudence.

December 18: O Adonai (O Lord)

O Lord, and leader of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush and gave him the law on Sinai: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.

December 19: O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse)

O Root of Jesse, standing as a sign among the peoples; before you kings will shut their mouths, to you the nations will make their prayer: Come and deliver us, and delay no longer.

December 20: O Clavis David (O Key of David)

O Key of David and scepter of the House of Israel; you open and no one can shut; you shut and no one can open: Come and lead the prisoners from the prison house, those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

December 21: O Oriens (O Morning Star)

O Morning Star, splendor of light eternal and sun of righteousness: Come and enlighten those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

December 22: O Rex Gentium (O King of the nations)

O King of the nations, and their desire, the cornerstone making both one: Come and save the human race, which you fashioned from clay.

December 23: O Emmanuel (O Emmanuel)

O Emmanuel, our king and our lawgiver, the hope of the nations and their Savior: come and save us, O Lord our God.

These are powerful words for a powerful time of year. Notice how December 21st, often the darkest day of the year, is when we pray for the morning star to come and enlighten us. Additionally, the first letters of the titles (**S.A.R.C.O.R.E.**) taken backwards form the Latin phrase *ero cras*, tomorrow I will come.

Perhaps this Advent season, praying these powerful words leading up to Christmas will spur us to action rooted in the wonder and awe of the Christ Child. Such prayer, combined with accompanying actions, would be a radical statement of hope and peace in a world of seeming darkness. Will you pray these together with me this December?


