Intern Selection Process



Pál Pusztai will begin his intern year among us in July 2017. Here is a brief autobiography he as offered us in preparation for his year among us.

Pál Ignác Pusztai is originally from the Ohio City area of Cleveland, OH. He served in the U.S. Air Force in the early 1980s and then stayed on with the Department of Defense (DoD), retiring in 2015 with 35 years of distinguished service. Pál worked his way through college--an accomplishment he is particularly proud of--earning degrees related to his position within the DoD. Immediately upon retirement, Pál began his studies at the Gettysburg campus of the United Lutheran Seminary to realize the call to the ministry. He lives in Dover, PA, and his home congregation is St. Matthew Lutheran Church in York. Pál also is a Stephen Minister for his home church where he heads a grief recovery

support group (GriefShare) and for SpiriTrust Lutheran in York in addition to being an Associate Chaplain at York Hospital. Pál is the proud father of a son, Jonathan, who began his military career in the U.S. Marine Corps but now serves in the U.S. Army. On the side, Pál is a professional musician and has freelanced since the mid-1970s. Pál, who is Hungarian, is very aware that his name is not easy to pronounce. Pál is just the Hungarian spelling of "Paul" so addressing him as "Vicar Paul" will be just fine! He is excited and looking forward to being at St. Peter's for internship!

Pastor Ross will be at the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Gettysburg along with our 2017-18 intern, Pál Pusztai, on May 23-24 participating in a two-day team building workshop, for the purpose of establishing some interpersonal connections, engaging in some goal identification for the year, and participating in discussions about what makes a healthy team. 

Suk Shuglie



Suk was born in Seoul, South Korea, and grew up on a farm in Yesan, a small town about 100 miles south of Seoul. She was one of eight children. She has been painting most of her life and describes her paintings as "impressionistic expression" using lots of color to create warmth and vitality. Throughout her primary and high school years she took advantage of every art class available. Her life changed profoundly in the late 1970's when she met Wes Shuglie. They were married in 1980. Moving to Lancaster and far from her beloved home-land that she knew so well, she painted to relieve feelings of homesickness. During the 1990's, Suk obtained a degree from the Pennsylvania School of Art & Design. She also attended classes at

Millersville University in addition to master classes in Florence, Italy and Barcelona, Spain. She has achieved a wide, well-earned reputation in the Lancaster area and Mid-Atlantic region. She wanted to create a sense of continuity and permanence to the relationships she built up during her appearances at art shows. She thought the best way to do that was to open her own art gallery, which she did in 1997, the Suk Shuglie Gallery in Lancaster. St. Peter's is delighted to display some of Suk's paintings in our Art Hallway.

Kim (Groff) Sterner



Kim is a life-long member of St. Peter's and daughter of George and Movita Groff. She has been collecting "vintage" jewelry since 1985 and now has over 2,500 pieces from designers including Eisenberg, Weiss, Coro, Sara Coventry, Trifari, Kramer, Miriam Haskell, Monet and Napier. "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit"

Evangelism is the gift that moves believers to reach non-believers in such a way that they are baptized and become active forces in the Christian community.

Scripture References (NRSV):

Matthew 28:18-20 – "And Jesus came and said to them [the Disciples], "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age."

Romans 10:14-15 - "But how are men to call upon him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without a preacher? And how can men preach unless they are sent? As it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who preach good news!'"

Ephesians 4:11-12 – "And his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, for the equipment of the saints, for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ ..."

People that have this gift,

communicate the message of the Bible with clarity and conviction;

have the ability to insert spiritual truths into normal conversation with unchurched people, and the ability to sense the timing of when to do so;

challenge unbelievers to faith and to become fully devoted followers of Christ;

adapt the presentation of the gospel to connect with the individual's needs;

have the ability to converse easily with strangers and people of short acquaintance.



Pastor's Letter

"I do, and I ask God to help and guide me."

Dear Friends:

These are the words that you will hear twelve young women and men voice at one of our three Sunday morning, May 21st worship services. It is the traditional response to the Affirmation Address statement to which each confirmand is asked to respond, as part of

the Rite of Confirmation. Call it "Affirmation of Faith" as our hymnal does ... call it "Confirmation," which is its traditional name ... call it "a ritual of adult membership" which speaks to its practical implications, as "confirmed" status in the Lutheran Church allows you to vote on significant issues presented to the congregation ... call it "renewal" if you want



a simpler term. Whatever the title, it is the moment in the lives of many Protestant teenagers, when they have the opportunity to say "Yes" to the baptismal promises that teenager's parents made on their behalf on the day of their baptism.

I like the term "renewal," even though it is not a liturgical term, because it points to the ongoing nature of what will happen for a dozen young adults in our congregation. The Rite of Confirmation, or Affirmation of Faith as our hymnal titles the rite, is never a once and done event. Most of us have at least a few moments in life when our faith is



renewed. Sometimes it is another ritual in the church's life ... a marriage, a funeral, a baptism we observe. Sometimes it is a human event which "renews our faith in humanity." Sometimes it is a personal moment of crisis or opportunity in which prayer, reflection or conversation leads us to look at the world with more hopeful eyes. God is in the business of offering us regular moments of renewal, when we have the eyes to recognize those moments.

So why not consider those opportunities in life when God might be offering you a chance to renew your faith. Maybe that opportunity will involve a person with whom you are estranged, who was a faith partner with you at a former time in your life. Maybe that opportunity will involve an activity that used to offer you the satisfaction of sharing a God-given talent or passion in a small corner of the world. Maybe that opportunity will be a re-engagement with the Spirit of God in your life, through renewed prayer, or reading, or worship. Whatever the "renewal" is that God offers to you, why not take that "leap of faith" back into a closer walk with God. If you are with us on May 21st, maybe watching a few young adults have the courage to publicly proclaim their commitment to the God who fashioned and formed them will be enough motivation in itself. I'll look forward to potentially sharing that moment with you when I next ...


through thick and thin. It also reminds me of the shepherds God has placed in my life. My parents, my teachers, my mentors of the faith are all shepherds that God has placed in my life.

Core Value and Mission Forums: This May!


Last month we filled out a Church Ministry Core Value Questionnaire during our April 2 services. We received many responses. Thank you!

Letter From the Vicar

Grace and peace to you all from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!
