Fall Wednesday Morning Bible Study

Mark your calendar now for **Wednesday**, **September 12th** for our first Wednesday Morning Bible Study Class of the fall. This year we will again have a two-semester system in which we study two different topics.

We will start the year exploring the topic "Comparison of World Religions," and examine: the five major world religions in terms of followers, which includes Judaism and a couple of others including those who consider themselves as "unaffiliated".



We'll spend the remainder of the year studying a comparison of all four Gospels, seeing which stories are common to all four Gospels, and which stories have a singular unique status in just a single Gospel.

Why not consider joining this vibrant group of 40-50 fellow believers this fall as we study familiar material in ways that always open up faith discussion, historical reflection, and theological questions. We have a strong class that has the involvement of both church members and community members, which creates an atmosphere that is rife with conversation and insights offered from both leaders and participants. Pastor Ross facilitates the class which meets in the Café on Wednesdays from 9:30-11:00 a.m. Friends are welcome. Modest snacks and drinks are provided.

Health and Wellness Committee

AUGUST – Schedule your physical



You probably know that August is the time to schedule your children for their school physical and wellness exam. This visit includes a review of their physical well-being, including a hands-on assessment of their organs like the heart, lungs, abdomen and extremities. The visit may also include required shots/vaccines for their age and to meet school requirements. These "well child checks" are important to assure proper growth, development and health, and to uncover and treat anything that may be found (asthma, allergies, etc).

However, if you're an adult, (with or without children), have you thought about getting *your* annual wellness visit? Depending upon your age, the visit may include the exam noted above, or maybe not.

Some annual wellness visits don't involve a physical exam. It's not always about a hands-on assessment and checking your heart, etc., (although it's important that you routinely see your doctor for those chronic diseases to be addressed). An annual wellness visit covers things we don't often think about: screening for depression, checking on our memory, assessing our ability to walk (to avoid slips/falls), and making sure we truly understand our risk for certain diseases. Most importantly, we can learn what to do about those risks.

So, if you always think about your children or your spouse - it's time for all of us to make sure we think about *our* health, and get that annual wellness visit as recommended by our doctors. **Always check your insurance, to assure they pay for a yearly *physical* OR the *annual wellness visit* - they are different.

Pastor Sarah's Message



Dear friends in Christ,

During the month of July I was able to attend a Summer Institute for Church Leaders at United Lutheran Seminary in Gettysburg, PA focusing on Biblical and Digital Storytelling. The sessions lifted up the art of storytelling—particularly God's story.

As we were sharing faith stories and folktales, I found myself thinking about a favorite folk story of mine. It's called "Stone Soup." Perhaps you've heard of it? The story goes like this:

A traveler comes to a village, carrying nothing more than an empty cooking pot and a stone. Filling it with water, the traveler sets the cooking pot (and 1 ingredient—the stone) on the fire. One of the villagers becomes curious and asks what the traveler is doing. "I'm making stone soup. It's pretty good. Want some? All it needs is a little bit of garnish to improve the flavor."

"Sure thing! I have just the right thing!" says the villager, who anticipates enjoying a share of the soup, so offers a few carrots to the pot. Another villager walks by, inquiring about the pot, and the traveler again mentions their stone soup which has not yet reached its full potential. "Want some? All it needs is a little bit to of seasoning to improve the flavor." The villager hands them a little bit of seasoning. More and more villagers walk by, each adding another ingredient. Finally, the whole village finds their fill enjoying a delicious and nourishing pot of soup—a type of soup that no one could have enjoyed if it were not for the traveler and his stone!

During these last few weeks I have experienced our own versions of stone soup, and they've come in the form of strawberries, parade floats, and Bible school.

I look at the many hands that went into bringing the June **Strawberry Festival** into fruition (pun intended...get it? FRUIT-ion?!). From planners to youth volunteers, from organizers to bakers, from donators to purchasers—you all created an event that brought joy to our community in St. Peter's and beyond.

I recall the July 4th festivities and have great joy that St. Peter's could be represented as a parade float in the **Lititz Parade**. The float was decked with St. Peter's signs, the New Day band praised God and invited people to worship with us, and the community beyond our walls got to experience a piece of what makes St. Peter's a vibrant faith community. I marveled at the New Day Committee's organization, gave thanks for the many ways you all donated candy, wagons, trucks, and your time to make this event happen!

I'm still humming some of the songs learned a few weeks ago at **Vacation Bible School**, and give thanks that St. Peter's can offer a week of faith building and Bible learning to the whole community. I also realize that your leadership, the giving of your time and talent, and the offering of your joyful spirit (even after a LONG day at work) created an atmosphere for the children of our community to come and learn.

All of these events point to the way we are living out our proposed mission statement: "Building a community of faith by God's grace."

And maybe we do have a Stone Soup in our midst. In our case, our stone is the rock of our foundation—Jesus Christ. And I give thanks for the many ways that you participate in coming together to create community, to grow faith, and live into God's love.

From the Director of Music

Four Readings on Sunday

And on the day called Sunday, all who live in cities or in the country gather together to one place, and the memoirs of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read, as long as time permits; then, when the reader has ceased, the president verbally instructs, and exhorts to the imitation of these good things.

Okay, maybe we don't read, as Justin suggests, for as long as time permits. After all, wouldn't it be easy to get carried away and read the Bible for the whole day?! Yet, we do hear four different texts from the Bible on Sunday morning. These readings prescribed by the Revised Common Lectionary, which has its own interesting history, form the basis for the liturgical year. Even more interesting to me, are the relationships between these 4 readings.

The first reading is most often from the Old Testament. Whether a part of a narrative, a prophecy, or some commandments from God, this is our first glimpse into the theme for a given Sunday. It is followed immediately by the song of all the gathered people Justin the Martyr has mentioned (that's us!). This song, the Psalm, acts as a direct response to the first reading. For example, on August 5th we hear Nathan's rebuke of David for taking Uriah's wife after causing his death. We place ourselves within the story then when we sing Psalm 51 saying, "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love" and "Create in me a clean heart, O God." David's sins become our sins and we pray to God for forgiveness as David did.

The reading from the Gospel usually relates to the themes found in the first reading and psalm. Often we'll hear something of Jesus' teaching on the subject. Other times, the Gospel may be tangentially related or a solution to a problem raised in the earlier readings. Again, on August 5th, Jesus teaches he is the bread of life and that forgiveness and wholeness come from him. So, after praying to God to make us whole, we hear that David is restored, and so are we, through God's great mercy in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus we enact every Sunday.

This leaves the second reading, which usually comes from one of the epistles (letters to the early churches). These readings usually work through one of these epistles over the course of a number of weeks and do not intentionally relate directly to the themes found in the other readings. Why read them, then? These epistle readings often offer concrete advice for dealing with a variety of relational issues or they may clarify a theological point. Personally, I find it interesting to note that the early church dealt with many of the same issues we deal with today and I find some of the wisdom of the apostle Paul and other writers to be invaluable on the journey of faith.

So, each of the four readings on Sunday come together to form something that is larger than their individual offerings. The Old Testament and Psalm pairing draw us into the theme for the day, making these stories our stories. The New Testament reading shows us that the church has always been the church and though we may feel we're dealing with new problems, there's nothing new under the sun. Finally, the reading from one of the four Gospels will offer another insight into the themes we have been drawn into at the beginning of our reading. The four readings on Sunday work together as a feast, with a little something for all who have gathered, whether from the city or the country.
