Sacrament of Holy Baptism





Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends:

Most of you would not have known Margie. She and her husband Clark joined the church about fifteen years ago in their senior years of life. They were mostly involved in Sunday worship and later in our home communion ministries when each of them faced complications with their health. Only a few of you will remember Carl and Alma, if you go way back to life in the 1980's at St. Peter's. Carl was a retired professor of then Gettysburg Lutheran Seminary, and Alma was his "beloved bride" when they joined St. Peter's in their twilight years. However, both of these couples were present in our St. Peter's community this summer, even though Margie & Clark have been part of the communion of saints for a year

or more, and Carl & Alma have been with Jesus for more than 25 years. They were present through the legacy gifts they entrusted to St. Peter's congregation, through the gifting plans they made through their estates following their deaths. Margie and Clark were fairly traditional in their planning, leaving a gift to the church in their wills, after both of them passed from life in this world. Carl and Alma actually entrusted their financial resources to their daughter, who upon her death, honored her parents' wishes by making a significant estate gift to St. Peter's congregation in their memory. In total the two gifts amounted to slightly more than \$100,000. and both gifts came to us this summer within a few weeks of each other.

I share this news with you, in part to honor these two families who were deeply faithful to the church in their years on earth, and who also chose to extend that faithfulness beyond their earthly years, through their estate planning. October is a season in which we direct a more focused eye on our stewardship ministries through the invitation to be a part of our Fall Stewardship Drive. That involvement consists of considering the tithes and pledges you will offer to the church in the 2019 year, along with the commitments of time and talent service you will also make to God's church. But this news also serves as an invitation for you to consider making provisions for planned gifts to St. Peter's and other charities for which you are passionate, whether you are engaging in the initial process of estate planning in your family life, or considering amending your plans to include St. Peter's. These "planned gifts" strengthen and equip the mission of our congregation and of the other organizations for which you have a passion. At St. Peter's, these planned gifts that we receive are used in ways that honor the intentions that families give to us through their estate planning.

As we reflect on the abundant blessings God places into our hands for stewarding in the world, we ask you to consider not only the ways you support God's mission in the world today and next year, but also how you will support God's mission in the world when your time comes to join the Church Triumphant at the end of your earthly days. I would be more than glad to have a conversation with you around this topic if you would find that helpful, whether you wish to alert the church to the plans you've already made to bless St. Peter's ministries with a planned gift, or you are considering how best to include St. Peter's in your legacy planning. Be a blessing to the God who has blessed you.

Pastor Sarah's Message

Dear friends in Christ,

I want to begin my message by giving thanks for you and the community of faith that we call St. Peter's Lutheran Church. Thank you for this shared ministry and being the body of Christ together. I thought it may be helpful to use my pastor's message this month to write about some ministry elements that have been part of our communal conversations these past few months.

Mission/Vision Statement

During the past year the Mission Statement Development Team has been hard at work in crafting a mission statement. This work could only be done by your participation in meetings, small

groups, and town halls. The proposed mission statement is "Building a community of faith by God's grace." We hope that you have been able to offer some input to the mission statement these past months. Recently, the team continued their work on crafting a vision statement. Where a mission statement is a broad, brief statement of what we should be doing, a vision statement is a more detailed picture of what this mission looks like.

On July 22nd the Mission Statement Draft Team met and reviewed the many notes from congregational input as well as some demographic data of the community St. Peter's serves. With these tools by our side, the team endeavored to create a vision to accompany St. Peter's proposed mission. The draft of the mission and vision statements can be found in the pages of this newsletter. It is our desire to bring the mission and vision statement to the congregation during our October 21st Town Hall meeting. Join us on October 21st during the 9:15 a.m. session. We hope to see and hear from you!

Conversations on Communion and the Means of Grace

The conversation of communion and frequency of receiving Holy Communion has come up in a number of venues at St. Peter's including the worship committee, some Christian Education classes, and a spring forum. During the summer our Revised Common Lectionary featured 5 weeks of passages from John 6, known as "Jesus as the bread of life" chapter of John. In conjunction with the lectionary, the rostered leaders planned a sermon series (July 29-August 26) which lifted up themes. These themes included: Holy Communion as Christ feeding our bodies and souls, Holy Communion as our Heavenly Father's work in us, Holy Communion as connection to our loved ones living and dead, Holy Communion as a promise from Jesus, and Holy Communion and frequency for our community.

From the Director of Music

Hymn of the Day as Proclamation

The song we sing near the sermon has a variety of names in a variety of worship settings: de tempore hymn, sermon hymn and hymn of the day. Each term has a history of its own and here at St. Peter's we typically choose the last option to describe what is going on at this point in worship. This hymn of the day, sung by all the gathered people of God, sums up the gospel message heard in the readings for the day.



As a worship staff, we often plan this hymn first for a given Sunday as it holds such a place of honor within the structure of the worship service. How might the choice to call this hymn a sermon hymn alter the way we choose this hymn? What conclusions can we draw from our decision to call this the hymn of the day? For me, one of the most important implications of using this term is that this is a place where the whole people of God proclaim the good news to the community. Rather than being an extension of the sermon, this hymn is the *people's* chance to preach in word and song.

Let's take a closer look at the hymns of the day throughout October:

The gospel reading for October 7th (Mark 10:2-16) has Jesus delivering a difficult teaching on the relationship between divorce and remarriage and the old testament readings (Genesis 2:18-24, Psalm 8) remind us that we are meant to live in community. Trying to make sense of this, we sing the somewhat lesser known "Our Father, by Whose Name" where we sing of the relationships God blesses us with and remember that the family of God is much wider than may appear at first glance.

Jesus continues to disappoint (!) on October 14th with his direction to the rich man to sell all he possesses and give the money to the poor (Mark 10:17-31) and the old testament reading (Amos 5:6-7, 10-15) yields similar warnings. As a response and prayer to God, we choose to sing a peppy rendition of "Take My Life, that I May Be". This peppy tune reflects the joy giving one's life to God can generate, rather than the despair over the loss of what once was.

On October 21st we find Jesus paradoxically telling the disciples that to be great, they must become servants (Mark 10:35-45) and today's reading from Isaiah 53:4-12 is part of the servant songs found in the prophetic book. We proclaim this posture of servanthood well when we sing in the third stanza of "The Church of Christ, in Every Age".

Then let the servant church arise, a caring church that longs to be a partner in Christ's sacrifice, and clothed in Christ's humanity.

Finally, on Reformation, our Lutheran rallying festival, Jesus tells us, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (John 8:31-36) and God says, "I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts" (Jeremiah 31:31-34). Our hymn of the day, "Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in your Word", becomes a prayer to the Holy Trinity to keep this word in the forefront of our minds.

From lifting up the blessedness of living in community to asking God to keep us steadfast, we lift up love, self-sacrifice, service, and all those things God has written on our hearts for the sake of the larger community. As part of our public gathering, the words we sing and say form us and send us out to do the important work of loving all of God's people. The hymn of the day is our way of sharing what God teaches us, both for the sake of our gathering and for the sake of the world. Proclaim it loudly!
