

# **Annual Congregational Meeting -- Sunday, November 11th**

This year's Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, November 11<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 a.m. in the church sanctuary. Both early



and late services will meet at the same time at 9:00 a.m. either in our traditional or New Day congregations, and then will gather in the sanctuary for the 10:30 a.m. meeting. A Sunday School experience will be offered for all non-confirmed children and youth. Confirmed youth can vote in the proceedings, so we hope they will be with us in the meeting. Following the 10:30 a.m. meeting we will have a modest coffee hour in the narthex for those wishing to stay and chat for a few minutes. It is a great way to get to talk with people you might not normally see, because you worship in different worship venues.

At this year's meeting we will conduct typical business such as approving the 2019 budget, electing congregational officers and council members, and receiving a few reports from some congregational committees and leaders. We will also be invited to formally approve our proposed Mission & Vision statement, and vote on our constitution that has been in a revision process over the past two years. You should attend for two reasons: (1) We need a quorum to conduct business; and (2) It is your responsibility to take ownership for these items which are entrusted into the hands of the congregation gathered at this meeting. We hope to see you on the 11<sup>th</sup>.

# Veterans Day, November 11, 2018

At 11 o'clock in the morning of the 11th day of the 11th month, in the year 1918, World War I – known as the *Great War* – came to an end exactly one hundred years ago. This special holiday was first created as Armistice Day in 1919 by President Woodrow Wilson. November 11th became a federal holiday in the United States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became known as Veterans Day, a day when we remember and honor those who served in the military. This year, at St. Peter's, our Archives Committee will be displaying our Honor Roll from World War II. This weathered wooden Honor Roll was originally displayed outdoors and in front of our former church in

Neffsville. The names of our members who served appear on this Honor Roll. Thank you to ALL of our St. Peter members who have served... both past and present.



"Just when things seem worst, Sang Ly learns a secret about the ill-tempered woman they call 'the rent collector' who comes each month demanding money – a secret that dates back to the Khmer Rouge and sets in motion a tide that will change the life of everyone it sweeps past.

"The Rent Collector powerfully illustrates how literacy can change lives and how anyone can 'rise from the ashes' in the most unlikely of places."

# Pastor's Letter

Great things are not done by impulse, but by a series of small things brought together.

~ Mary Anne Evans (writing under the pen name George Eliot)

Dear Friends:

In some ways November is filled with "small things" that are brought together to make greater things. We celebrate All Saints Sunday to start our November Sabbath observance – a day which includes the powerful Litany of the Saints ritual. In this litany, we recall the names of church members and loved ones who have died since last year's All Saints Sunday.

Any one of those lives might be seen as a tiny part of the human family ... just one person. But when joined to the others on our litany list, and ultimately to the saints of every time and every place, we are confronted with what the author of Hebrews describes as "so great a cloud of witnesses." It is what we refer to as "the communion of saints" in our creed every week. And thus we recognize the blessing of being a part of this magnificent Christian tradition.

On the second Sunday of November we hold our Annual Congregational Meeting. Few events here bear the truth of Evans' quote above, than this meeting in which literally dozens of small things done by church members come together in this review of St. Peter's church life since last year's annual meeting. It is a celebration of the ministry of volunteers, committee members, worship participants, faithful stewards of their time, talent and treasure, Council leaders, and staff members. Whether you are a brand new member or a fifty year member, there is something of value you can learn at this meeting, which is one of the great events of the year, and an essential one for the well-being of the congregation and its ministry.

The third Sunday in November is Commitment Sunday, when we culminate our stewardship campaign for 2019. This is about as routine an event as exists in the lives of Christian churches. But I cannot emphasize more strongly the importance of this fall stewardship emphasis. We have literally hundreds of givers in the congregation who give in different ways and with different means. The collection of all those gifts, however modest, creates a base of support for program, building and staff expressions of our ministry together – the "great things" God does among and through us.

I suppose Thanksgiving speaks for itself, in terms of the variety of small things that characterize that special day (which in many cases is a "weekend" of activity). Food, football, shopping, family, travel, service and worship meld into what is for many a major celebration that is unlike any other holiday of the year. A side note ... you will want to be aware that Thanksgiving Eve worship will return to our sanctuary this year as we host the Manheim Township Ministerium Thanksgiving Eve Service on Wednesday night, November 21 at 7PM.

Our last Sunday of the month is Christ the King Sunday when we anticipate that great day when God will gather every small piece of life and creation into whatever final expression of the Kingdom of God our creator has in store for us. Thematically, it epitomizes Ms. Evans' quote above and together with the rest of the month's activities embodies the "greatness of small things brought together."

Dear friends in Christ,

How is the air around you? When you wake up in the morning, do you pause to take a breath, fill your lungs, and breathe out? When you're out shopping and doing errands, do you have breathing room? And as you close your eyes, is your breath calm and restful?

I ask these questions because of a comment I heard the other day. I was in a meeting and one of the participants made mention that there seems to be anger in the air. Wherever they went they couldn't quite get away from a bitter, aggravated spirit that seemed to be in the world.

Back in the day, my grandfather would take a bus to work. He was always sensitive to the emotions around him, and if he was sitting next to someone who had a bitter or angry spirit it would affect his health for a good day or two. The spirit of anger and bitterness can really cloud our world!

I'm sure you can think of a few things that have gotten your ire up...it happens to us all...and before we know it, there's a dark cloud around us filled with stuff that seems to pollute the very air we breathe. Anger and bitterness, when transformed from a temporary emotion into a state of being, can be quite destructive to our very soul. Can't they?

This is why I personally look forward to this time of year. Actually, I need this time of year! I turn my monthly calendar and I see at the end of it that there is Thanksgiving.

For me seeing that holiday marked on my calendar is a reminder to open the windows and get the old air out of the lungs, and to take a new breath in. Breathe in a new spirit.

Remember, spirit is breath, and the Holy Spirit is the breath of life.

As Christians we are called to live into a daily thanksgiving that is not simply reserved for a specific calendar day. And when the spirit of bitterness or anger gets the best of us, we are reminded again of the Holy Spirit who holds us, our almighty Father who gives us another day to try again, and our Savior Jesus who breathes upon us a spirit of peace.

"Life is a gift, totally given to you without cost. A daily and chosen "attitude of gratitude" will keep your hands open to allow and receive life at ever-deeper levels of satisfaction." -Richard Rohr, *Breathing Under Water: Spirituality and the Twelve Steps* 

So how is that air around you? Breathe in, breathe out. Take God's Spirit of peace in, and whatever's been building up within... breathe it out. Let it go.

A reflection of who's sitting around you in the pews, members of St. Peter's bring light into the world in all these areas: Animal Adoption/Pet Therapy, American Heart Association, American Cancer Society, Crisis Pregnancy, Theatrical and Musical Arts, Blood, Clothing and Food Banks, Colleges, Community Life Task Force, Companionship to the Sick and Elderly, Early Education, Elections, Global Missions, Girl and Boy Scouts, Lion's Club, Habitat for Humanity, Lancaster General Hospital, Love, Inc., Hospice, Life Skills Training, Military Honor Guard, Marching Band, Physicians for Peace, PTO, Stephen's Ministry, Tax Preparation, Therapeutic Horseback Riding, Tutoring, and serving on the Youth Aide Panel for a Police Dept. Others consistently cook, bake, garden, read, maintain and repair things on an "as needed" basis, to the blessing and benefit of others. The wave of blessing is building, but hasn't nearly begun to crest. I say the wave hasn't crested yet, because, believe it or

not, all of these areas reflect just twenty five of you! But, we are already covering ground from PA to Africa. I'm still working on an electronic solution to gather more data. I appreciate the written slips, emails and notes you've left me so far. Keep them coming.

On another note, I attended an Equipping Faith Leaders workshop with a few members of our congregation at the end of October. People are interested to learn what role the church can play in responding to opiate and other substance abuse disorders. A team ministry run by lay leaders will be trained and developed, with an aim toward prevention and recovery support. If you are interested in attending either of the two remaining educational sessions, or have an interest in becoming part of this ministry team, please phone or email me, asap. I'm looking for people who have or feel a personal connection to anyone ever involved in this type of tragic social and personal crisis. As your vicar, I hope to facilitate bringing this faith initiative to St. Peter's.





# From the Director of Music

#### **Feast Your Eyes on Thanksgiving**

November is a time we often think about feasting. Of course, we have the greatest feast of the whole year, that most wonderful event of the whole holiday season, Thanksgiving.

Bear with me here. I know that the traditional Thanksgiving story we tell is at best a feel-good story about people of different backgrounds getting together to give thanks for the harvest of



In a recent Jubilate Choir rehearsal, I asked the choristers what they thought we were saying when we sang the words "Come, let us eat for now the feast is spread" in the beloved communion song. We talked about what you need for a feast with the obvious answer of a lot of food (and some great beverages, right?). We got a little stuck on the idea that all you get at communion is a little piece of bread or a wafer. In the song, how can we call such a small meal a feast?

As we continued our discussion we discovered that a lot of people eat different kinds of bread as a staple of their diet. We talked about how without bread, we probably wouldn't be here today and how feeding 300-400 people a meal in church is amazing and thinking about all the churches everywhere where people are fed was mind-blowing. Maybe, just maybe the bread we receive was a sign showing how God always provides for us.

The meal we have during worship has a lot of names: Holy Communion, Lord's Supper, Sacrament, Eucharist. This last term, Eucharist, comes to us from an ancient Greek word meaning Thanksgiving. You may have noticed that at times we pray a Eucharistic Prayer during our liturgy. This act turns our attention to the honor and thanksgiving we show for Jesus' saving death on the cross. Perhaps praying over, distributing, receiving, and singing about communion are all demonstrative acts of thanksgiving to God.

Feast language abounds in our liturgical music and hymns. We sing "This is the Feast," in a variety of ways at the beginning of our traditional services. We sing of breaking bread together on our knees, the bread of life from heaven, coming to the hungry feast, and more. On All Saints' Sunday, we are particularly aware that this feast is really a foretaste of the feast to come when we will all be fed by God. This summer we spoke and sang about Jesus, the bread of life, and we often sing of God forming us into the body of Christ for this world, gathered into one in the same way grain is gathered for the bread.

Such feasts and thanksgivings will not come to fruition without the final step. As a called people of God, we seek to share the good news embodied in this feast with all of God's children. This meal does not turn us inward, but rather turns us outward. The final verse of "Come, Let Us Eat" is our guide:

Rise, then, to spread abroad God's mighty word. Jesus risen will bring in the kingdom.

Having received grace ourselves, we are tasked with spreading the news, always remembering that it is Jesus who saves us with outstretched hands on the cross.
